

#### Streetscape History

• 2004: Ingersoll Study completed

• Called for "Unified, pedestrian friendly street"

• Developed Ingersoll as "logical bicycle link to downtown"

• 3-lane reconfiguration recommended to accommodate bicycle lanes.

• 2007-2008: Streetscape improvements and plantings

• 2010: 4 to 3 lane conversion completed

• 2018: Streetscape Phasing Study by the Avenues

• Called for "Protected Bike Lane"

• Identified Phases for Implementation

• Recommended "Green" infrastructure

• Modified Planter Railings

• 2019: Cross Section Approved by the Avenues (SSMID)






#### Recent Improvements

#### 2020

• Streetscape Constructed on North Side of Ingersoll Ave between MLK Jr Pkwy & 24th Street (Phase 1)

#### 2021

- Streetscape Constructed on North Side of Ingersoll Ave between 24th Street & 28th Street (Phase 2)
- Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project Started between 35th Street and 41st St
- Ingersoll Reconstruction from 42nd Street and Polk Blvd Completed.







- Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project Continued between 35th Street and 41st St

#### 2023

- Streetscape Finished on South Side of Ingersoll Ave between MLK Jr Pkwy & 28th Street (Phase 3)
- Western Ingersoll Sewer Separation Project Continued between 35th Street and 41st St
- 28th Street Reconstructed from Linden St. to Woodland Ave.

### Phase 4 – Project Objectives

- 1. Increase safety for all users
- 2. Maintain and enhance existing streetscape
- 3. Create vibrant commercial corridor with uniform look



#### Phase 4 – Construction Tasks


1. Replace aging roadway pavement between planters





## Phase 4 – Project Objectives

- 2. Add Raised Bike Lane
- 3. Add Permeable Paver Parking
- 4. Add more Storm Sewer





### Phase 4 – Parking Goals

- Maintain on-street parking
- Increase off-street coordination


- Close excess driveways
- On Street Parking Net Change: -8 stalls





### Updated Sight Distance Standards


• Sight distance after bike lane clears – sight distance doubles by car removal






### Phase 4 – Construction Staging

Five construction stages are required to keep two-way traffic operational, and parking available on one side of the street






Stage 1 will be replacement of lead water services using localized traffic control





#### Stage 2 will replace half of the roadway surface


- Traffic will be separated by construction
- Parking will be available on the south side of the street





#### Stage 3 will replace the other half of the roadway surface


- Traffic will be separated by construction
- Parking will be available on the north side of the street





#### Stage 4 will install the north raised bike lane and parking

Parking will be available on the south side of the street





#### Stage 5 will install the south raised bike lane and parking

• Parking will be available on the north side of the street





### Construction Staging

- Impacts to businesses will be driveway replacements and reduced on-street parking.
- Some driveways (1-point of access only) will be reconstructed outside of business hours.
   (night work)
- Steel plates will be placed over any excavations during business hours to maintain access.
